VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

For the 2016 general election, **proof of identity must** be presented with either:

- Valid Arizona driver license
- Valid Arizona non-operating identification card
- Tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal identification
- Valid United States federal, state, or local government issued identification


or

- Two forms of ID that include your name and address, or
- One form of photo ID and one form of non-photo ID that includes your name and address

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the upcoming election, make sure you are registered by October 10, 2016.

There is neither same-day registration nor Election Day registration.

REQUIREMENTS

Any person may register to vote, provided that he or she:

- is a citizen of the United States;
- resides in Arizona and county listed on registration;
- is at least 18 years old on or before election day;
- has not been barred from voting due to a disqualifying felony conviction;
- and has not been declared mentally incompetent.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, your **right to vote may be restored** after your term of incarceration and after completion of parole/probation, and payment of all fines for a first and only one-count felony conviction. Visit **www.azsos.gov/elections** for more details.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

All registered Arizona voters may request and mail an absentee ballot without an excuse.

- Must be requested by **October 29, 2014** (eleven days before Election Day).
- Must be received by 7:00 pm on Election Day.
