VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

For the 2016 general election, **you will be asked for a form of identification (ID) when you vote.** Acceptable forms of ID include:

- Your current driver's license, or
- Any pre-printed form of identification that shows your name and address, or name and signature, or name and photograph (including credit cards, checkbooks, utility bills, and paychecks).

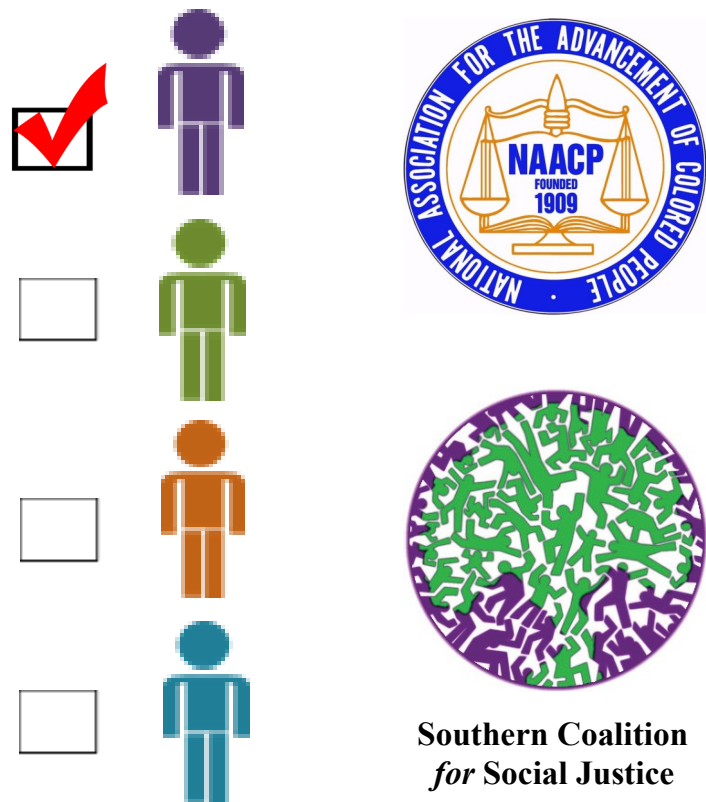

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the upcoming election, make sure you are:

- **registered in person by Tuesday, November 1, 2016** (7 days before Election Day), or
- **registered via mail by Tuesday, November 1, 2016** (7 days before Election Day).

You may register in person on Election Day at your town's Election Day Registration location. Contact your local registrars of voters.

REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in Connecticut, you must:

- be a U.S. citizen,
- be a resident of Connecticut,
- be at least 18 years old by the next general election and not registered in any other county or state.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, your right to vote will be restored after your term of incarceration and after completion of your parole.

EARLY VOTING

Early voting is not offered in Connecticut.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Voters may request and mail an absentee ballot only with an acceptable excuse. Acceptable excuses include:

- Being an active member of the armed forces
- Being out of town during on Election Day
- Illness or physical disability
- Holding religious beliefs that prevent you from performing secular activities on Election Day
- Performing duties as an election official at a polling place other than your own.

An absentee **ballot can be mailed to you beginning Friday, October 7, 2016**. Complete the ballot following the instructions that are included and **return it by mail or in person before the close of polls on Election Day**.
