

VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

When you go to the polls to cast a ballot, you will be asked to produce photo identification (ID). The following types of photo ID are acceptable: driver's license or state-issued ID card, federal or state government-issued photo ID, U.S. Passport, military ID with photo, student ID with photo, tribal ID card with photo. The ID does not need your address. **If you do not have photo ID or do not bring it with you to the polls, you may still vote** by signing an affidavit with a ballot that will be counted.

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the upcoming election, make sure you are **registered by Tuesday, October 11, 2016** (30 days before Election Day).

REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in Michigan, you must be:

- a U.S. citizen
- a resident of Michigan, and city or township you are applying to register
- at least 18 years old by Election Day.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, you may register to vote after you complete your terms of incarceration.

You can vote while on probation and parole. Visit www.michigan.gov/sos for more information about registering to vote.

EARLY VOTING DATES

There is no early voting in Michigan.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

All registered voters in Michigan may request and mail in an absentee ballot, but only with an excuse. Acceptable excuses include being:

- age 60 years old or older
- unable to vote without assistance at the polls
- expecting to be out of town on election day, or in jail awaiting arraignment or trial
- unable to attend the polls due to religious reasons
- appointed to work as an election inspector in a precinct outside of your precinct of residence.

Absentee ballots **must be requested by 2:00 pm on November 5, 2016** (the Saturday before Election Day), and must be **received by 8:00 pm on Election Day**. Visit www.michigan.gov/sos for details.
