
# 2016 VOTER GUIDE

### **VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS**

In order to vote in the 2016 election, you only need to bring identification (ID) with you if you are new to Minnesota (MN) and registered by mail, or are planning to register at the polls. You can present one valid photo ID with your name and address, such as: valid MN driver's license or learner's permit, MN ID card, or tribal ID card (or receipt for any of these). OR, you can present any photo ID along with a current student fee statement, a current utility bill, or a rent or mortgage statement.

# EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

### REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the upcoming election, make sure you are **registered by October 18, 2016** (21 days before Election Day). You can **register in person on Election Day at your polling place and vote**, if you bring proof of identity and residency (listed on the back of this guide).

### **REQUIREMENTS**

To register to vote in Minnesota, you must be:

- a U.S. citizen
- a resident of Minnesota for 20 days
- at least 18 years old by Election Day.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, your voting rights are restored and you may register to vote when your terms of incarceration, probation and parole are complete. Visit **http://mnvotesinfo.sos.state.mn.us/voters/** for more information.

#### **EARLY VOTING**

You can vote early with an absentee ballot in person at your county elections office, or vote early by mail. You can request, receive and cast an absentee ballot in one visit to your county election office as early as Friday, September 23, 2016 (46 days before Election Day).

### **ABSENTEE BALLOTS**

All registered voters in Minnesota may request and mail in an absentee ballot. Voters need to have a notary from any state or a registered Minnesota voter sign their envelope as a witness.

- May be requested as early as Friday, September
  23, 2016 (46 days before Election Day).
- Must be received by 8:00 pm on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, 2016.
