VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

In order to vote in person, you must present a valid form of identification (ID) that shows your name, residential address, and date of birth. Acceptable forms of ID include:


- Current driver's license,
- Current non-driver's ID card,
- Tribal government issued ID card,
- Long-term care certificate (provided by ND facility).

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

North Dakota does not require voter registration.

All eligible voters may vote in an election if the voter provides acceptable identification (ID). Acceptable forms of ID are listed on the back of this guide.

REQUIREMENTS

To vote in North Dakota, a person must be:

- A United States citizen;
- At least 18 years old on the day of the election;
- A North Dakota resident;
- A resident in the precinct for at least 30 days preceding the election.

If you have **been convicted of a felony,** your voting rights are restored automatically after release from prison. Visit **https://vip.sos.nd.gov/** for more details.

EARLY VOTING DATES

All eligible North Dakotans have the option to request a ballot before the day of an election by absentee voting.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

All North Dakota voters may request and mail an absentee ballot without an excuse.

- May be requested as early as Thursday, September
 29, 2016 (requested up to 40 days before Election
 Day).
- Must be postmarked by Monday, November 7, 2016 (the day before Election Day).
- Must be received by close of polls on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, 2016.
