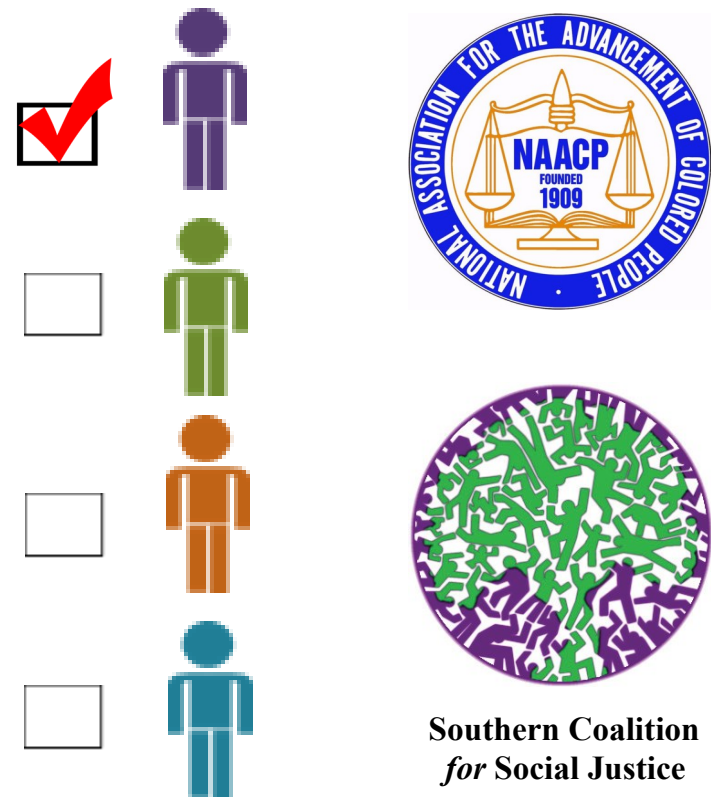

VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

For the 2016 general election, **you must show a valid form of photo identification (ID) in order to vote.** *An acceptable document must have been issued by the US government, State of Oklahoma, or a federally recognized tribal government (must contain name of person, photograph, and expiration date after election).* Additionally, voters may also show the free Voter ID Card issued by the County Election Board. If you do not have ID, you may still vote by provisional ballot and sign a sworn affidavit.

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the upcoming election, make sure you are **registered by Friday, October 14, 2016.**

There is no same-day or Election Day registration.

REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in Oklahoma, you must be:

- a U.S. citizen,
- a resident of Oklahoma,
- at least 18 years old by the next general election.

If **convicted of a felony**, you may register and vote when the number of years for which you were originally sentenced (including incarceration, probation, or parole) has passed. For example, if you were sentenced to 10 years, but only served 8, you still have to wait 10 years from the sentencing date to register. Visit www.ok.gov/elections for details.

EARLY VOTING

Early voting dates for the general election are

Thursday, November 3 - Saturday, November 5, 2016.

LOCATIONS

Contact your local county board of elections for early voting locations and times.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

All registered voters in Oklahoma may request and mail in an absentee ballot without an excuse.

- Must be **requested by 5:00 pm on Wednesday, November 2, 2016** (six days before Election Day).
- Must be **received before 7:00 pm on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, 2016.**
