

VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

Oregon votes by mail, so there are no voter identification requirements for voting. However, if you fail to sign the ballot declaration, your county elections department will contact you.

VOTING BY MAIL

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the upcoming election, make sure you are **registered by Tuesday, October 18, 2016** (at least 21 days prior to Election Day). Online registration requires a current Oregon drivers license or state ID card.

REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in Oregon, you must be:

- a U.S. citizen,
- a resident of Oregon,
- at least 17 years old, but you will not receive a ballot until an election occurs on or after your 18th birthday.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, your voting rights are restored when your terms of incarceration are complete (upon release) and you may then register to vote. You are eligible to register to vote while on probation or parole.

VOTING BY MAIL

The state of Oregon votes by mail.

1. **Receive your ballot** – You should receive your ballot two to three weeks prior to Election Day. You can visit <http://sos.oregon.gov/voting-elections/> to track your ballot and update your address and party affiliation.
2. **Vote your ballot** – You will receive a ballot and security envelope in which to return your completed ballot. If you need a replacement ballot, contact your county elections department.
3. **Return your ballot** – Your ballot and envelope can be stamped and mailed or simply dropped off at any official drop box across the state. If you cast your ballot after Friday, November 4, 2016 (the Friday before Election Day), the ballot should be left at a drop box site to ensure it's counted. **Ballots must be received by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, 2016.**
