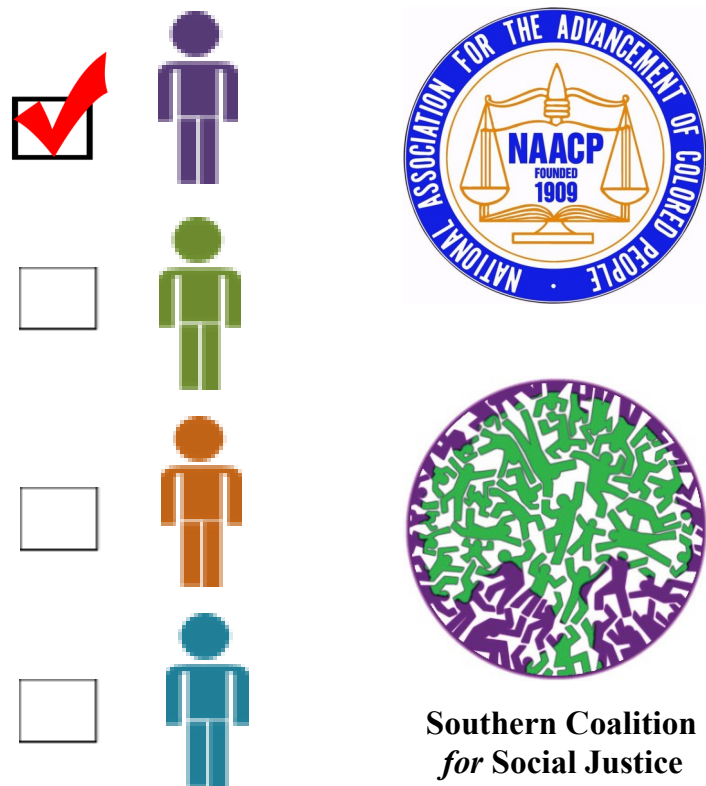
VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

For the 2016 general election, **you will be required to show one of the following forms of photo identification (ID) in order to vote in person:**

- Texas driver license,
- Texas Election ID Certificate issued by DPS,
- Texas personal ID card issued by DPS,
- Texas concealed handgun license issued by DPS,
- Military ID with photo,
- U.S. citizenship certificate with photo,
- U.S. Passport.

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

To vote in the upcoming election, make sure you are registered by **Tuesday, October 11, 2016.**

REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in Texas, you must be:

- a United States citizen,
- a resident of the county where you submit the application,
- at least 18 years old on Election Day.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, you may register to vote after terms of your incarceration, parole, or probation are complete. Visit www.votetexas.gov for details on how to register.

EARLY VOTING DATES

Early voting dates for the general election are **Monday, October 24 - Friday, November 4, 2016.** Contact your local county board of elections by phone or visit them online for early voting locations.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

In Texas, you may request and mail in an absentee ballot only if you are:

- aged 65 years or older;
- are disabled;
- out of the county on election day and during the period for early voting by personal appearance; or
- confined in jail, but otherwise eligible.

Absentee ballots must be requested by **Friday, October 28, 2016** (11 days before Election Day), and must be received by **7:00 pm on Election Day.**
