

VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

For the 2016 General Election, only first time voters who have registered by mail have to show identification (ID) in order to vote. If you registered when you renewed your driver's license, or as part of a voter registration drive, you will not be required to show ID.

VOTER REGISTRATION

EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

REGISTRATION DEADLINE

You must be registered by **Wednesday**, **November 2**, **2016** to vote in the upcoming election. There is neither same-day registration nor Election Day registration.

REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in Vermont, you must:

- be a citizen of the United States;
- be a resident of the state of Vermont (and a resident of the town in which you apply to be added to the checklist);
- have taken, or have previously taken, the Voter's Oath (formerly called the "Freeman's Oath"); and
- be 18 years of age or more.

If you have been **convicted of a felony or are currently incarcerated**, you can still vote. Register in the town or city in which you resided previous to being incarcerated.

EARLY VOTING DATES

You may request an early or absentee ballot by telephone, fax, email, mail, or in person. Absente ballots are available within 45 days of the election. You may check the status of an absentee ballot at: https://mvp.sec.state.vt.us/.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

All registered Vermont voters may request and mail an absentee ballot without an excuse. Absentee ballot applications must be:

- requested by 5:00pm Monday, November 7, 2016, and
- received by the close of polls on Election Day.
