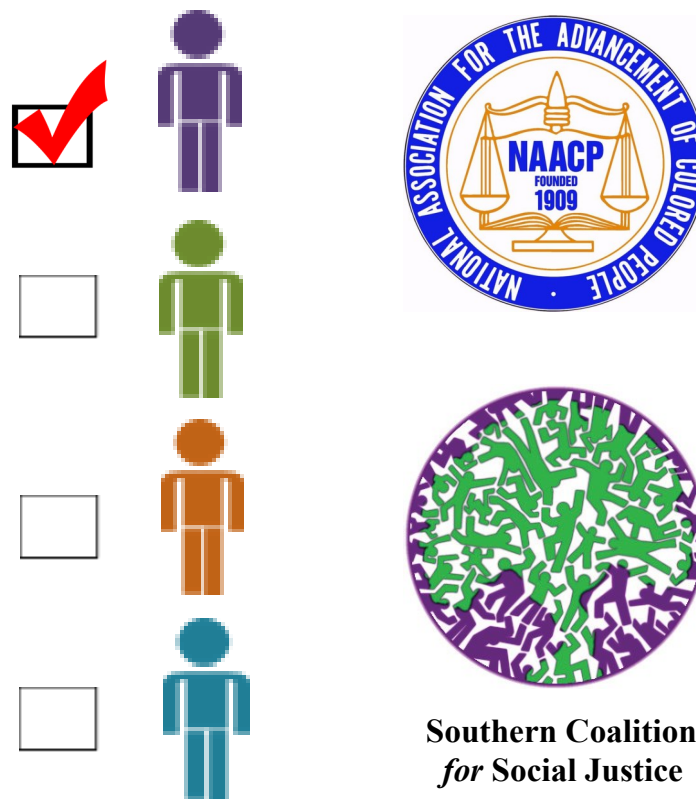
# 2016 VOTER GUIDE

## VOTER ID REQUIREMENTS

In order to vote in person, you are **only required to present a form of identification (ID) if you did not submit identification with your mailed-in, first time registration.** Acceptable forms of ID include: any valid and current photo identification, passport, utility bill, paycheck, bank statement, or government-issued document. All other voters may state their name, address and year of birth as proof of ID.

# VOTER REGISTRATION

# EARLY & ABSENTEE VOTING

## REGISTRATION DEADLINE

You must be registered by **Tuesday, October 11, 2016** (at least 29 days prior to Election Day) to vote in the upcoming election.

There is neither same-day registration nor Election Day registration.

## REQUIREMENTS

To register to vote in New Mexico, you must be:

- a U.S. citizen
- a resident of New Mexico at least 29 days
- at least 18 years old by the next general election.

If you have been **convicted of a felony**, you can register to vote after the terms of incarceration, probation and parole are complete. Visit [www.sos.state.nm.us](http://www.sos.state.nm.us) for more details.

## EARLY VOTING DATES

Early voting dates for the general election are **Tuesday, October 11- Saturday, November 5, 2016.**

## LOCATIONS

Contact your local county board of elections about the availability of early voting, along with times and locations.

## ABSENTEE BALLOTS

All registered New Mexico voters may request and mail an absentee ballot without an excuse.

- Must be **requested by Friday, November 4, 2016** (4 days before Election Day).
- Must be **received by 7:00 pm on Election Day, Tuesday, November 8, 2016.**
